WE CONTINUE TO COOPERATE WITH DRIVING SCHOOL JEDNIČKA

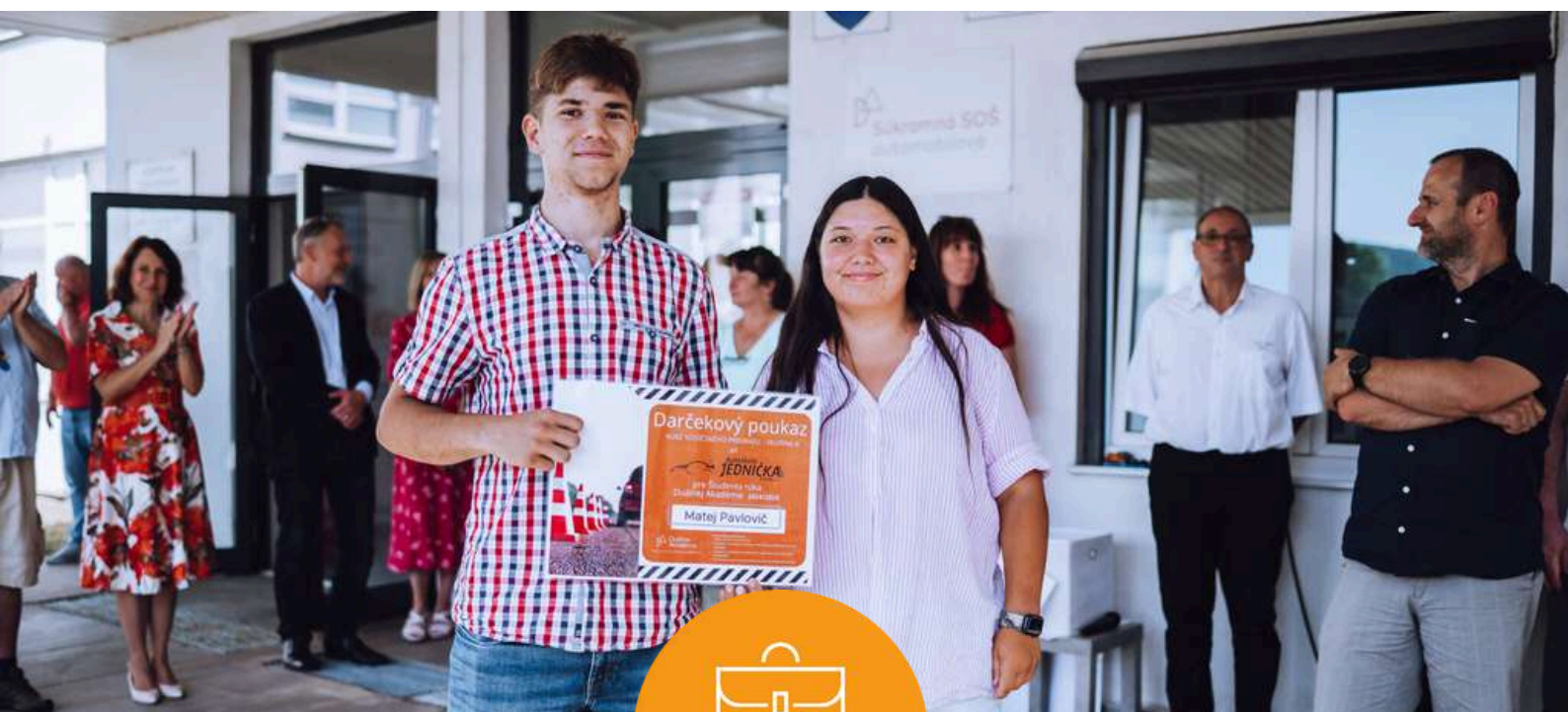
We have started our cooperation in full swing!

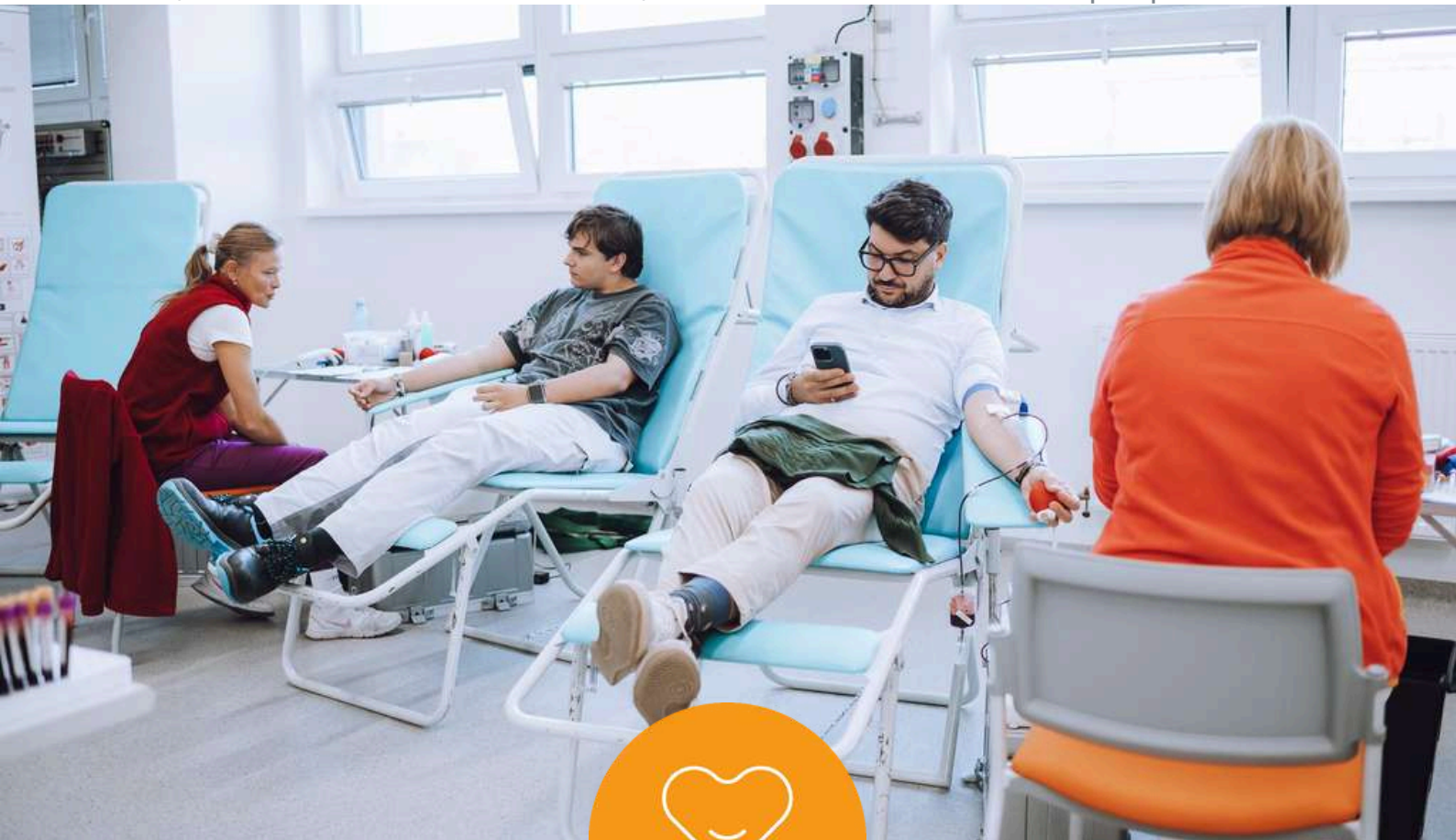
REGULAR BLOOD DONATION THANKS TO NTS (The National Transfusion Service of SR)

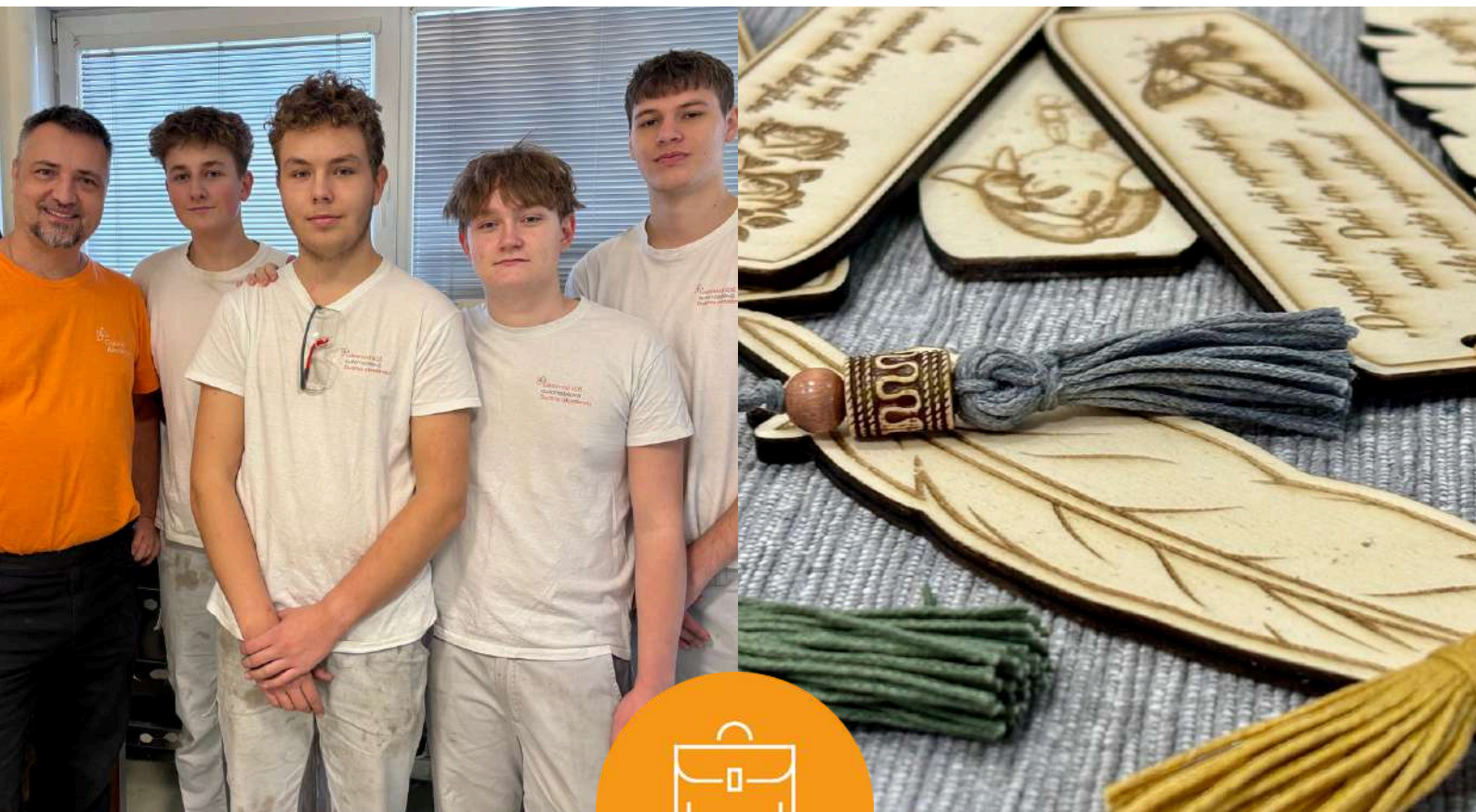
BOOKMARKS THAT CONNECT SLOVAK SCHOOLS

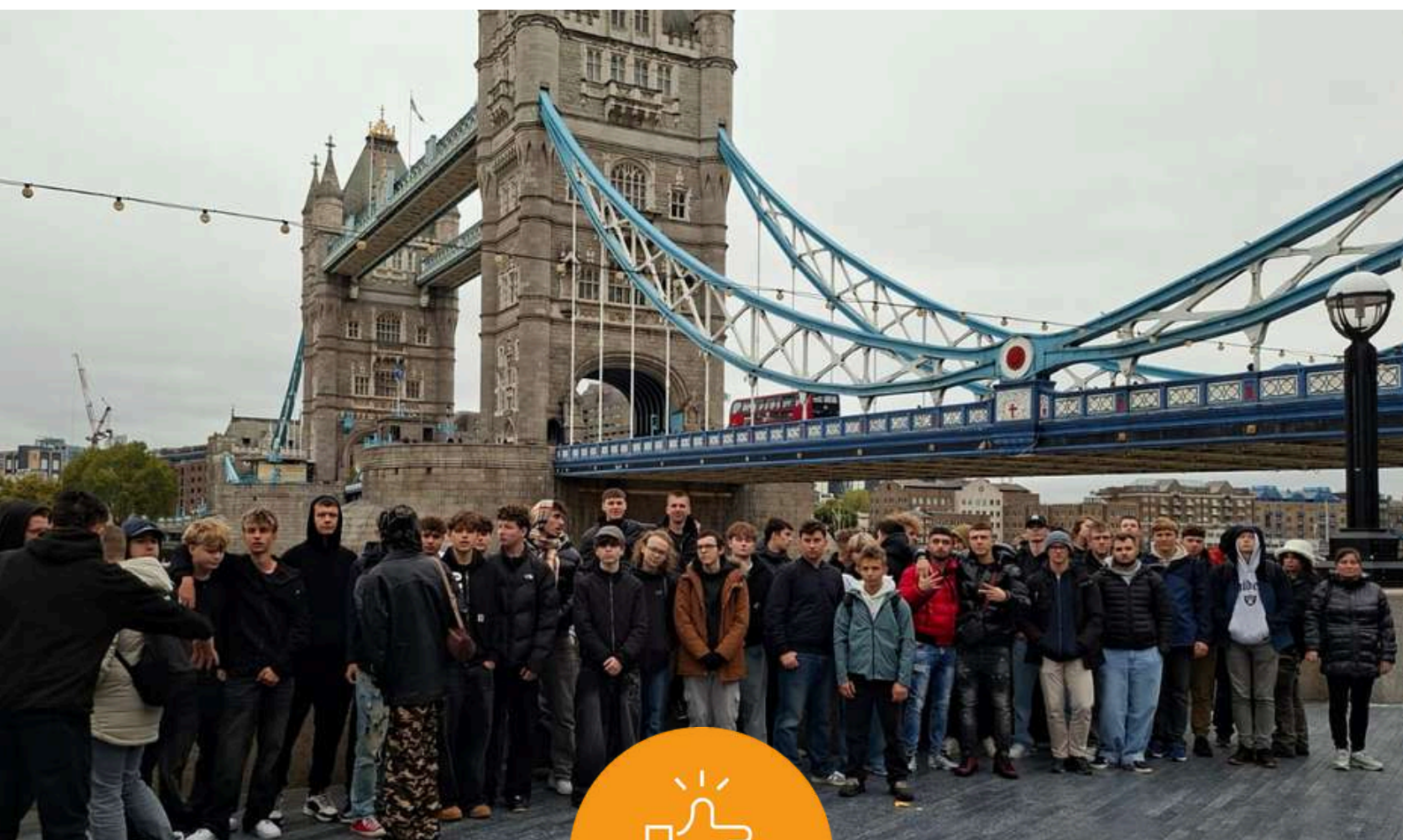


STUDENTS EXPLORE THE WORLD

Six second-year students from MM class completed an Erasmus+ mobility program at the Dresden City Transport Company from October 12 to 24, 2025.

WE HAVE OBTAINED THE SEVA ELF CERTIFICATE

SEVA ELF is an initiative of the Slovak Electric Vehicle Association (SEVA) that supports Slovak companies in their transition to greener and more sustainable transportation.

The SEVA ELF certificate, which companies can obtain at no cost, recognizes efforts in the development of e-mobility. The Dual Academy is among the organizations that have received this certification. Companies of all sizes can apply for the certificate, which is categorized based on their progress in electrifying their transport.

The certificate features three categories: FAN, FRIEND, and CHAMPION, representing different stages of fleet electrification. The transformation process takes time and involves a series of steps, including developing the initial idea, acquiring the first electric vehicle, establishing charging infrastructure at company locations or employees' homes, allowing private cars to charge using company chargers, and facilitating the charging of company vehicles at home, followed by the settlement of expenses.

5 QUESTIONS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHER PETRA HLAVATÁ



Answering:

Mgr. Petra Hlavatá

School special needs educator

With Dual Academy since June 2025.

How has the school prepared for inclusion in relation to the growing number of students and the diversity of their needs?

With the increasing number of students with special educational needs, the school needed to recruit a special education teacher to the school support team, who would be familiar with the current setting of support measures enshrined in legislation - so I have been here since June 1, 2025 😊 and together with other members of the Special Education Team, we are trying to "tweak" the system in our school so that every student can find a safe space for their personal and professional growth.

Do you see differences in the support needed by students in the Technical Lyceum - Bilingual Studies program compared to other programs?

Some technical high school students come from the eighth grade, making their transition more challenging. Interviews show a preference for professional practice over theory, but the support needed remains similar across students.

What specific steps do you take to identify students with special educational needs?

The primary method for identifying students with special educational needs (SEN) is through direct classroom observation, conversations with parents, discussions with individual students, and strong collaboration with teachers. Many students with learning or behavioral difficulties are identified before entering secondary school, so my focus is primarily on supporting those who have already been diagnosed, rather than on initial screening.

How do you collaborate with teachers to create individual plans or make teaching adjustments for students with specific needs?

An Individual Education Plan (IEP) is created based on recommendations from the counseling center. If observations during lessons suggest the need for an IEP, we hold a meeting to establish tailored goals, methods, and teaching adjustments. We continuously monitor the student's progress and adjust the plan as needed, with open and personal communication as a key component.

Can you provide an example of how a special education teacher positively impacted a student's progress?

I have been at the school for a short time, but I believe my contributions will be evident during evaluation periods. I am collaborating with teachers to provide support for students with different mother tongues and am focused on helping first-year students transition from elementary to secondary school through a preventive program and situational interventions.

5 QUESTIONS FOR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST IVANA KAPALKO

School psychologist

With Dual Academy since september 2024.

How do you perceive the psychological well-being of students in connection with the rapid expansion of the school? What is the biggest challenge?

I have known Duálka from the outside since its beginnings and from the inside since September 2024. It's been wonderful to see how the school is evolving each year, with new spaces being added, renovations underway, and fresh classes introduced, bringing new faces, ideas, and energy. The school even changes its colors with every holiday. Transitions always bring uncertainty. The move to high school is significant; some students feel lost at first, while others embrace it as an adventure. We connect classes during INTRo days to help students get to know each other and feel more at ease. Ultimately, it's crucial for every student to feel "at home" at school—to feel they belong, that someone knows them by name, and that they are more than just a number. I may not know all the students yet, but I'm getting closer! 😊

The new Technical Lyceum – Bilingual Studies major is demanding. How can stress and overload among students be prevented?

The best protection against stress and overload in every area is balance, even though it may sound too simple to work. But it works! The essential thing is to first realize where we are going too hard, what needs to be added, and where to ease up, knowing how to work hard, but also knowing how to turn it off, the simple rule of balance. No extreme works in the long run. Find time to move, get quality sleep, do things that you enjoy, meet friends, and take a break from the screen more often. And what is very important, you need to openly talk about it, if there is a lot, that it is simply a lot! Sometimes just naming it and saying that "it is difficult" will bring relief. And teachers can always help by giving students space for dialogue.

What forms of support are available for students who feel overwhelmed or have difficulty adapting to a new environment?

Sometimes, things can really pile up. Certain periods are more challenging, and it's okay to admit that I'm not always able to handle everything. With a new environment, new relationships, expectations, and professional demands, I find myself learning, testing, dealing with conflicts, and experiencing fatigue, which can lead to feelings of sadness. During such times, it's comforting to remember that I have a cozy little room on the ground floor (my office) and a slightly larger, cozy room next door (Petka's office). In these spaces,

5 QUESTIONS FOR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST IVANU KAPALKO

In these spaces, I can collapse into a chair or lounge on the couch and instantly feel at home, whether it's in the living room or the children's room. Here, I can talk about anything in a safe environment or simply be silent if that's what I need. Sometimes, the kids come over for no particular reason. They pop in to say hello, check how I'm doing, or see what sweets I have in my bowl. Other times, they sense that I'm struggling and come by to offer support. Honestly, there are days when I wish I could clone myself along with my entire office just to handle it all.

How do the dynamics between students change in classrooms where students from different majors and grades meet?

It takes time for the students to "settle in." After many years at their respective schools, 24 young people suddenly come together, not only of different ages but also from diverse backgrounds, each with their own temperament and character. Since some come from the eighth grade while others are from the ninth, they bring different interests and experiences to the group. It can be challenging at first, but over time, they begin to work together surprisingly well. Each new group needs to establish its own rules to function effectively. It's important to give these young people the time and space to develop into a cohesive team. The class teacher plays a crucial role in this process, helping to connect the students, ease tensions, and create an environment where their varied personalities can thrive. This allows them to experience success and appreciation, enabling them to be their true selves. I believe we are gradually making progress in this area.

What would you recommend to parents and educators to help young people manage pressure to perform while maintaining mental balance?

I often feel that children have too many demands on themselves. Of course, there are parental expectations, but even without them, they create a lot of pressure on themselves. They want to do everything, be good at everything, not disappoint, succeed. And sometimes they just need to hear that they don't have to. That they can have a day when they don't feel like it, when they don't feel good, when they can't do it — and that even then they are ENOUGH. That a person's value does not change based on performance. That's why I have a sign above my door that says "you are enough" (even so that I don't forget it myself).

I tell them that taking care of yourself is not selfish. It's basic. Allowing yourself to rest, sleep, be silent, a moment without your phone, being outside, laughing, switching off. All of this is part of balance. When we learn to listen to our bodies and minds, we have more energy, peace, and joy.

And sometimes it's enough to just be there for them, to listen, not to judge. Children don't need perfect adults, but ones they feel safe with. Parents and teachers don't always have to have the answer; they can just be that safe place to come to, even if something doesn't work out. Not a place where you are evaluated, but where you are listened to. Often, you don't need to look for solutions - just being there is enough. And let's not forget that we adults also need time for ourselves - not only to get more done, but to feel good. I keep repeating that if I'm not okay, I can't be here adequately for those children, so unsolicited advice in closing: me first 😊 (take care of yourself first ❤️)

He has been working in the organization since 2012, and since 2019 as director.

Cooperation with **Dual Akademy since 2022.**

Could you introduce your organization in three short sentences?

The Slovak Electromobility Association (SEVA) has represented the interests of the zero-emission transport sector since 2012. With over 70 members, including vehicle manufacturers, importers, and charging infrastructure providers, SEVA voices electromobility in Slovakia and actively shapes legislation and public discussions on transport transformation.

Why did you decide to cooperate with DA, or why do you think DA is your member (decided to cooperate with you)? Give three reasons.

The Dual Academy is a natural partner for us because electromobility involves not just technology but also the people who can develop, produce, service, and use it safely. Our expert working groups have consistently highlighted the need to modernize vocational education and strengthen the connection between industry and schools. We view our collaboration with the Dual Academy as an investment in the future—one that supports the development of talents who are already shaping new competencies for sustainable mobility today.

What are the most important news stories that have happened in your organization?

Over the years, SEVA has established itself as a respected expert in discussions about the future of transport, energy, and industry. In addition to collecting and analyzing market data, we are increasingly involved in commenting on legislation and representing expert opinions in legislative processes.

A vital aspect of our work is professional communication. Through webinars, participation in conferences, and the preparation of position papers and analytical materials, we facilitate connections between companies, public administration, and professionals who contribute to the electromobility ecosystem in Slovakia. We organize regular working group meetings and expert discussions, providing a platform for the exchange of experiences and solutions to current challenges in the sector.

Furthermore, we continue to deliver analytical outputs, including data on public charging infrastructure and vehicle fleets, while maintaining communication with the professional and business communities. Notable events include conferences and webinars, such as eFleet Day Truck&Bus&Van 2025 and a webinar focused on how to implement electromobility in companies.

INTERVIEW WITH PARTNER ORGANIZATION SEVA

Will you tell readers something they won't read elsewhere?

SEVA manages Slovakia's only comprehensive database of public charging infrastructure, which is utilized by state institutions and the media. We manually update the data for each location in collaboration with our members and operators. Additionally, we are a member of the European association E-Mobility Europe and actively participate in developing European standards for batteries, infrastructure, and fire safety.

If you had to describe your company in one word?

Members of SEVA have access to exclusive data, expert analyses, position papers, and consultations on legislation. They can participate in working groups, events, international projects, and discussions with government representatives. SEVA provides them with a platform to contribute to the national and European dialogue regarding the transformation of the automotive industry, transportation, and energy sectors.

Please also explain the SEVA ELF project to our readers.

It is an initiative that recognizes and supports companies, institutions, and organizations transitioning to greener, more sustainable transport. The SEVA ELF certificate is an official recognition of activities in the field of electromobility development. It is awarded free of charge in three categories – FAN, FRIEND, and CHAMPION – according to the level of electrification of the company fleet and the implementation of charging infrastructure. The aim is to create a network of companies that are actively involved in the transformation of transport, share their experiences, and motivate others. The program also helps companies to become visible as employers that support sustainable mobility and a modern working environment.

The Dual Academy has already become a holder of the SEVA ELF certificate, thus confirming its commitment to preparing experts for new technologies in transport and supporting the transition to zero-emission mobility.

Could you introduce your organization in three short sentences?

The Slovak University and Industrial Educational Platform of the European Battery Academy (SKEBA), led by the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering at the Slovak Technical University of Bratislava, has been established as an association to support and implement training programs. These programs focus on the competencies and skills required by companies in the national economy within the battery and electromobility value chain. SKEBA aligns with the efforts of the European Battery Academy EBA250 (Battery Academy©) and aims to educate participants across various industry sectors in EU member states through modular training based on the EBA250 Battery Academy© model.

Why did you decide to cooperate with DA, or why do you think DA is your member (decided to cooperate with you)? Give three reasons.

The Slovak University and Industrial Education Platform of the European Battery Academy (SKEBA) was established as an association without legal personality. It was established with significant support from ZAP SR and the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering of the Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava, which is the leader of the SKEBA association. Its founding institutions were:

- Pavel Jozef Šafárik University in Košice, Faculty of Natural Sciences
- Technical University in Košice, Faculty of Materials, Metallurgy and Recycling

- Center for Scientific and Technical Information of the Slovak Republic

The main reason why we approached the Dual Academy was the need to find a strong partner with a strong connection to secondary vocational education and a specific company. And from that, your school clearly emerged.

What are the most important recent developments or plans in your organization (ideally related to dual education, adult education, you can mention other information related to education, legislation, etc. that is relevant to your organization)?

This association typically meets once a month and has been addressing key issues since its inception. Our focus areas include establishing a communication environment, equipping laboratories, promoting initiatives, and providing training. I am proud to share that Innoenergy successfully trained 25 trainers at the outset of our efforts.

To date, we have trained over 400 participants. Earlier this year, in March 2025, we were honored to receive the title of National Platform of Research and Education Infrastructure for Batteries and Electromobility from the Ministry of Education, Science, and Culture of the Slovak Republic. Currently, we are looking to accredit some of our courses, and the Dual Academy plays a vital role in this process due to its extensive experience.
